Meet Mr. Big Brown Bear. He lives in a house (that happens to be at the base of a tree), wears jammies and slippers, and eats breakfast just like you and me. It's fun to point out to your kids how the story characters parallel their own lives to some degree.

Throughout this book there are lots of references to up and down...'got the bowl <u>down</u> from the cupboard'...'<u>Up</u> to the mountains, or <u>down</u> to the seashore. <u>Up</u> to the <u>North</u> Pole, or <u>down</u> to the <u>South</u> Pole'. Each time these words are used, have your child point in those directions. Not only does this help with understanding what these words mean but it also helps with listening skills.

In the story there are some words that they may not use in their regular conversation. When bigger words are used, stop and talk about what they mean so that you help build their vocabulary skills.
