This sturdy board book allows even 2-year-olds to “look-inside” and find out interesting facts about colors.

Themes: Color and object identification

With die-cut windows and lift-the-flap pages, toddlers can uncover new images related to identifying colors. Why not make a look-inside picture of their own. Give your child a sheet of paper and have them draw squares. Depending on the age of your child, you may need to cut around three sides of the square and help your child fold the paper back. The squares can be folded at the side, from the top or from the middle. Tape a second sheet of paper on the back side of the first sheet. Now have your child draw or paste a picture on the paper under each opening. When they are finished, they can play a “peek-a-boo” type game by opening and closing the boxes. They can try to remember which picture is behind which flap.

Be sure to talk about the colors and objects in the board book as well as their newly created “flap sheet”.
