Children, in the very earliest years of their life, find comfort in familiar things and repetition. This book will introduce your child to familiar daily activities as you read about mice being kid-like. As you look at each set of pages, ask your child “do we say good morning each day? The sun is yellow. Can you point to the sun?” Let your child help you turn the pages. This board book is made for little fingers to get hold of.

On the page that asks what shall we do today, remember that sometimes children don't want to do an activity that everyone else is doing. At times like this, you may want to suggest a couple of other options. You, as the adult, get to come up with a couple of options that you feel are suitable for your child, but your child will have an opportunity to learn how to make choices.

The illustrations in this book are real simple and easy for a small child to identify...a mouse, a book, a ball, leaves. Once you've pointed out these pictures in the book, see if you can find these items in your house or yard. The mouse may be easy to make out of paper, too.
